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#### Dear Kirchentag participants

*Now is the time!* It's Kirchentag time – in the midst of crisis, faced with Russia's war of aggression against Ukraine, in the middle of global warming.

Kirchentag, that means five days of talking, singing, praying, enjoying art and culture. Listening and wrestling for hope and a vision – in view of all that concerns us at present. We come together, at one table, in one hall,

under one and the same sky, because we believe in a God who holds us together as one, despite all our differences.

How do we want to live? What can I hold on to? How are we to do business, with whom do we sign contracts, and at what moral price? How will we pass on the Earth to our children and future generations if we continue to burn its resources? These are pressing questions for our time. Now is the time for them. This programme is your introduction to the controversial questions and debates.

**"Now is the time. Repent, and believe in the good news"** (Mark 1:15). In saying that, Jesus had a ruler like Herod in mind. Herod had already locked John the Baptist up and prevented him from speaking out. Rulers like that are familiar today, as well. Many people looked away in fear. Jesus did not.

Jesus went to Galilee all the same, to the poorhouse of the world, and said: Now is the time. The Kingdom of God has come near, can you sense it already? We can act and live differently with one another. We are free, we can change. We can turn to one another in spite of all our diversity. Jesus reminds us of the best in ourselves. Now is the time for that. I myself am moved by the One who can hold us together as one, despite all fear and difference. The world desperately needs this.

We are holding the Kirchentag in a city with a certain history. The Nuremberg rallies during the Third Reich took place here and so did the trials of war criminals. It is a city that realised its guilt and repented, a city of human rights and peace. The German Protestant Kirchentag originated in 1949 from the failure of the Protestant churches during National Socialism. Clergy blessed weapons at the time and sanctified war. Each Kirchentag starts by remembering this history and remembrance will also shape the other days of this 38th Kirchentag. We have put the topic of human rights centre stage – and likewise the question of a new security order for the world.

What is new at this Kirchentag is our daring to tackle contentious issues more head-on than before. We are finally giving young people more space and a voice. We are not seeking false harmony. We want to hear opposing opinions and have brought representatives of the most varied positions onto the panels. And we will look for what connects us in many dialogue Bible studies precisely because we believe that God calls us to one table – despite all diversity. Now is the time. Time to seek what is binding and salutary. Time to say what I hope for and what I am willing to do on the basis of my hope.

### 8 INTRODUCTION

This booklet includes practical information and gives details of events of particular interest to international visitors. It would be impossible to translate the whole programme book, but we draw attention here to sessions with:

- International speakers
- Interpretation into English (from German and other languages)
- In English
- Other major events of particular significance or interest.

#### **Events with interpretation**

The Kirchentag provides simultaneous interpretation at some events. These are listed in this booklet with special symbols as shown on page ► 11. Please allow enough time before the session begins to collect your headphones. You will be asked to leave a deposit for headphones. If you want to attend an event without interpretation you can ask at the International Centre for a volunteer language steward to go with you. They do not give a full simultaneous translation but will give you a summary of what is said.

#### International Centre (Internationales Zentrum/IZ)

The International Centre (IZ) is open from **Tuesday 6 June** to **Saturday 10 June** from **09.00–20.00** and is the meeting point for international participants and their hosts. It is located in the central area of the Nuremberg Convention Centre (NCC Mitte) at the Nuremberg showground (Messe), just to the left of the main entrance. It provides services for participants from abroad and their hosts. The IZ team is available throughout the Kirchentag to offer help with any questions or problems in a variety of languages. There is also a cafe where you can take a break and meet up with other participants and with the members of the International Committee of the Kirchentag.

#### International welcome and information session

Wednesday 7 June at 19.00. This is a special welcome session for international participants directly after the opening service. It takes place in the Aufseßsaal at the Germanic National Museum (near to the opening service on the Kornmarkt). #### Changes to the programme

The Kirchentag is such a big event that it is impossible to avoid some last-minute changes to the programme. Updates are available during the Kirchentag itself:

- at the International Centre
- on the Kirchentag website www.kirchentag.de (German only)
- on the Kirchentag-app (German only)

#### Hall full (Halle überfüllt)

There will be times when the venues are full to capacity and people have to be turned away for health and safety reasons. Even if there appears to be some space left, please respect the Halle überfüllt signs and understand why you are turned away by the stewards. This is the only way to ensure the smooth and safe running of all the events at the Kirchentag. Thank you.

#### Stewards

Around 5,000 volunteer helpers take responsibility for various tasks and the Kirchentag would not be possible without them. These stewards are easily recognisable by their colourful *"ich helfe"* scarves. They help to prepare venues, give information, keep order, distribute headsets and much more, doing work which would otherwise have to be done by paid staff.

They are also given particular roles of responsibility such as closing the doors of venues that have been filled to capacity and staffing the left luggage locations. This means that they can sometimes find themselves under pressure in stressful situations. If problems arise, they need your support and your understanding, as for example when they have to keep emergency exits clear for Health & Safety reasons. Many of the helpers are from scout groups or youth organisations. Their uniforms, shirts and neckscarves are the expression of a longstanding and independent youth tradition in Germany.

#### **Environment and climate protection**

Kirchentag seeks to be the most environmentally-friendly large event of its kind and has held the European EMAS certificate for over fifteen years. The aim is to do everything possible to reduce energy consumption and to be careful with precious resources like water and food. As Kirchentag participants you are asked to play your part, for instance using public transport or bicycles. Please avoid unnecessary waste and sort your rubbish into the right bins. See also the headings *Bicycle hire, Food and refreshments, Travel* and *Waste* in the A to Z section.

#### **Bible studies**

Every day has its own Bible text, related to the theme. People from all walks of life interpret the Bible, often relating the texts to their own life and work. Bible studies are a key part of the Kirchentag and no other events go on at the same time.

#### **Celebratory communion services (Feierabendmahl)**

The celebratory communion service has taken place on the Friday evening at the Kirchentag for over forty years. Hosts and guests come together and celebrate a special communion service, get to know each other and exchange experiences.

#### Community singing with the Kirchentag song booklet

Take an active break at lunchtime: breathe deeply and sing. It will do wonders for your voice, mind and heart. Singing is led by musicians, choirs and bands. Explore the hidden depths of the song booklet.

#### **Prayers**

On Thursday, Friday and Saturday there are morning, midday, evening and night prayers which take place at various venues and also in local parishes around the city. This provides the liturgical heartbeat of the Kirchentag and is an opportunity to take a regular break for contemplation.

#### **Market of opportunities**

The market of opportunities is at the heart of the Kirchentag and over the years has developed into a vital meeting place for groups working in church and society. Over 500 groups present their projects, both large and small. Here you will find information as well as opportunities for discussion, networking and building new contacts. A map and the topic areas are shown on page  $\blacktriangleright$  64.

#### **Contributors (Mitwirkende)**

About half of Kirchentag participants are actively involved in making the programme happen: planning groups, brass band players, singers and speakers, in concerts, worship services, theatre and cabaret performances and running stalls in the market of opportunities. Not only Christians are invited to do this work, but also those from other religions and none. All who care about society and dialogue are welcome. If you would like to be involved next time, you will find more information in our newsletter and on our website.

#### Have your say - Kirchentag as a platform for discussion

Kirchentag participants are invited to have their say and express their opinions. This can be done in the formal sessions via the spokespersons for the audience, or directly using the hall microphones, by taking part in live votes or through digital participation. You will find formats such as simulation games, workshops, escape rooms or Bible drama. The Kirchentag also offers opportunities to participate on Instagram, Facebook, Twitter and Mastodon. More information is given in the A to Z section under the headings *Public Participation* and *Social Media*.

#### Accessibility and inclusion - everyone should be able to come

Accessibility is the key to wider participation. Everyone should be able to attend. This includes people in wheelchairs, those with sensory impairment or with learning difficulties, and anyone who faces obstacles to their desire to participate. The Kirchentag seeks to be open for everyone, diversity is an enrichment and a gift. This is one of the challenges of inclusivity. Everyone should be accepted as an individual as part of the whole community. The Kirchentag makes every effort to enable independent participation and active contribution in as many places as possible.

You will find helpful information on accessibility at the Kirchentag in the A to Z section under the heading *Accessible Kirchentag*.

### Accessibility of venues

The Kirchentag tries to make venues as accessible as possible. That means that there are no steps. Ramps are at most a 6% slope. Doors are at least 90 cm wide. Lifts are at least 140 cm long and there is an accessible toilet at the location. If venues are not completely accessible these pictograms are used:

 Limited accessibility
 At most one step, ramp with over 6% slope. Door widths between 70 and 89 cm, lift between 90 and 139 cm long.
 Open air: adjacent to paved paths, partly on unpaved ground.

- Not accessible Many steps, doors less than 70 cm wide, lift less than 90 cm long. Open air: completely unpaved ground.
- 🕅 No accessible toilet

We have marked a few accessible toilets on the city maps to be found on the web, in the app and in the envelope of the German printed programme.

#### Mark 1:14-15

**14** Now after John was arrested, Jesus came to Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God, **15** and saying, 'The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news.'

#### **Ecumenical service**

#### 2 Timothy 4:1-5

1 In the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who is to judge the living and the dead, and in view of his appearing and his kingdom, I solemnly urge you: 2 proclaim the message; be persistent whether the time is favourable or unfavourable; convince, rebuke, and encourage, with the utmost patience in teaching. **3** For the time is coming when people will not put up with sound doctrine, but having itching ears, they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own desires, **4** and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander away to myths. **5** As for you, always be sober, endure suffering, do the work of an evangelist, carry out your ministry fully.

#### **Bible Study Thursday**

#### John 2:1-12

1 On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. 2 Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. 3 When the wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him, 'They have no wine.' 4 And Jesus said to her, 'Woman, what concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come.' 5 His mother said to the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you.' 6 Now standing there were six stone water-jars for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. 7 Jesus said to them, 'Fill the jars with water.' And they filled them up to the brim. 8 He said to them, 'Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward.' So they took it. 9 When the steward tasted the water that had become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward called the bridegroom 10 and said to him, 'Everyone serves the good wine first, and then the inferior wine after the guests have become drunk. But you have kept the good wine until now.' 11 Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him. 12 After this he went down to Capernaum with his mother, his brothers, and his disciples; and they remained there for a few days.

#### **Bible study Friday**

#### Genesis 50:15-21

15 Realizing that their father was dead, Joseph's brothers said, 'What if Joseph still bears a grudge against us and pays us back in full for all the wrong that we did to him?' 16 So they approached Joseph, saying, 'Your father gave this instruction before he died, 17 "Say to Joseph: I beg you, forgive the crime of your brothers and the wrong they did in harming you." Now therefore please forgive the crime of the servants of the God of your father.' Joseph wept when they spoke to him. 18 Then his brothers also wept, fell down before him, and said, 'We are here as your slaves.' 19 But Joseph said to them, 'Do not be afraid! Am I in the place of God? 20 Even though you intended to do harm to me, God intended it for good, in order to preserve a numerous people, as he is doing today. 21 So have no fear; I myself will provide for you and your little ones.' In this way he reassured them, speaking kindly to them.

#### **Bible study Saturday**

#### Luke 17:20-25

20 Once Jesus was asked by the Pharisees when the kingdom of God was coming, and he answered, 'The kingdom of God is not coming with things that can be observed; 21 nor will they say, "Look, here it is!" or "There it is!" For, in fact, the kingdom of God is among you.'
22 Then he said to the disciples, 'The days are coming when you will long to see one of the days of the Son of Man, and you will not see it. 23 They will say to you, "Look there!" or "Look here!" Do not go, do not set off in pursuit. 24 For as the lightning flashes and lights up the sky from one side to the other, so will the Son of Man be in his day. 25 But first he must endure much suffering and be rejected by this generation.

#### **Celebratory communion**

#### Isaiah 49:8-10

8 Thus says the Lord:
In a time of favour I have answered you,
on a day of salvation I have helped you;
I have kept you and given you
as a covenant to the people,
to establish the land,
to apportion the desolate heritages;
9 saying to the prisoners, 'Come out',
to those who are in darkness, 'Show yourselves.'
They shall feed along the ways,
on all the bare heights shall be their pasture;
10 they shall not hunger or thirst,
neither scorching wind nor sun shall strike them down,
for he who has pity on them will lead them,

#### Psalm 31:14-24

14 But I trust in you, O Lord: I say, 'You are my God.' **15** My times are in your hand; deliver me from the hand of my enemies and persecutors. **16** Let your face shine upon your servant: save me in your steadfast love. 17 Do not let me be put to shame, O Lord, for I call on vou: let the wicked be put to shame; let them go dumbfounded to Sheol. 18 Let the lying lips be stilled that speak insolently against the righteous with pride and contempt. 19 O how abundant is your goodness that you have laid up for those who fear you, and accomplished for those who take refuge in you, in the sight of everyone! 20 In the shelter of your presence you hide them from human plots; you hold them safe under your shelter from contentious tongues. **21** Blessed be the Lord, for he has wondrously shown his steadfast love to me when I was beset as a city under siege. 22 I had said in my alarm, 'I am driven far from your sight.' But you heard my supplications when I cried out to you for help. **23** Love the Lord, all you his saints. The Lord preserves the faithful, but abundantly repays the one who acts haughtily. **24** Be strong, and let your heart take courage, all you who wait for the Lord.

#### **Opening Services**

#### Aid in response to the war in Ukraine.

Donations will go equally to aid projects run by the German Evangelical Lutheran Church in Ukraine and the project Pastoral Care for Ukrainian Refugees in Germany.

#### Deutsche Ev.-Luth. Kirche in der Ukraine (DELKU)

DELKU is a small Protestant church in Ukraine with congregations in Kharkiv, Odessa and Kyiv, among other places. Good local networks mean that they can respond quickly to emergencies and give help where it is needed. Since the full-scale Russian invasion they have been collecting food supplies and taking them to the war zones. They support refugees, organise accommodation for them and make provision for children and young people. After a year of war, their resources for providing assistance are very limited, which is why your support is so important.

#### Pastoral Care for Ukrainian Refugees in Germany

About one million Ukrainians have fled to Germany. Even if physically unharmed, they still need support through all the upheaval of being in a strange place and dealing with what they have experienced and memories of what they have left behind. The Evangelical Lutheran Church in Bavaria has employed a Ukrainian woman qualified in theological education to offer support and develop practical pastoral care in over 30 places in Bavaria. In addition, she has organised training courses in pastoral care for volunteers and local churches, and established networks for linking initiatives. #### **Ecumenical Service for Corpus Christi**

#### School gardens for children in Kenya

In Isiolo in Kenya crops are failing because of the long drought. Many children are on a government-funded programme to provide one meal a day. With this project, schoolchildren are planting fruit and vegetables in school gardens to produce crops to supplement their meals. They are learning innovative and water-conserving methods of cultivation, which are good for both climate and local soil conditions. They then pass on what they have learnt to others.



#### Accessible Kirchentag and the Centre for Inclusion

Everyone is invited to the Kirchentag! Everyone? Yes, everyone! This means that the majority of the activities and events are accessible. Inclusivity means that every single person belongs and is able to take part. This is an important aspect of Kirchentag, arising from our Christian conviction that all people are created in the image of God and are accepted and loved as they are. (Gen 1.27)

In practice this means equal and self-autonomous participation in the Kirchentag for everyone. In order to enable this and to dismantle barriers, the Kirchentag tries to make as many activities as possible accessible.

#### **Centre for Inclusion**

The Centre is a place for meetings and encounters. Those with and without disabilities can meet and share experiences. The café is a place to take a break and creative activities provide an opportunity for coming together. There will be podium events, concerts and activities. Some events will be in simple German. Subtitles and German sign language will be available. There is also a rest area with couches and beds available for a short break.

#### Accessible venues

The Kirchentag programme uses pictograms to indicate venues which may have limited access (or none) and/or no accessible toilets for wheelchairs. Pictograms also indicate which venues have an induction loop.

#### Induction loop

Many Kirchentag locations are fitted with an induction loop, which is automatically turned on for those events.

#### Toilets

Additional toilets are available at some venues. Accessible toilets are also available, some with care assistance. Accessible toilets are marked on the printed city plan and also on the website and the app.

#### Seating and wheelchair space.

For many events areas are reserved for wheelchair-users and there is also seating in those areas for people with limited mobility. It is advisable to arrive early at those events in order to claim a place. Some of these also have (German) sign-language interpreters and induction loops. You can also reserve places for the Opening and Closing Services - enquire at the Centre for Inclusion.

#### Accommodation

When you book your Kirchentag ticket, you can choose whether you want accommodation to be organised for you by the Kirchentag either in communal accommodation or at an official Kirchentag camping site for your tent.

If you would like private accommodation, please use the platform that has been set up through our partnership with Churchpool > unterkunft-kirchentag.de This is where those seeking accommodation free of charge and those offering it can be brought together. Simply enter your requirements and the system will connect you.

The Nuremberg Congress and Tourism Centre (CTZ Nürnberg) has set up a regional booking platform for Kirchentag visitors

Our free Kirchentag app brings together all the important information for you to carry around with you. It means you can get information about events, venues and announcements (e.g. programme changes). It also provides access to your ticket(s). You can create your own personal programme of favourite events.

For many of the events you can get information about the spaces available before they begin on the Kirchentag app and the website, using the *"traffic light"* system. **Red=hall full; amber=limited spaces; green=plenty of space.**

#### **Bicycle hire**

The VAG Rad bicycle hire company in Nuremberg will have bikes available during the Kirchentag. They have English-language pages on their website where you can register for the NürnbergMOBIL app, which gives information about the area covered (flexzone) and where the pick-up stations are. Please note: if you leave the bicycle outside the flexone there is a surcharge of 20 euros.

#### **Car parking**

Please use public transport if you possibly can. If you are dependent on travelling by car, we recommend using the Park&Ride facilities. There are a number of fee-paying car parks all over the city. There's a map showing these **>** www.parkhaus-nuernberg.de. Please note that during the opening Evening of Encounters there will be restrictions on cars entering the Old Town.

From Thursday to Saturday in the area around the Nuremberg Exhibition Centre (Messe) there are a few places available in the free car parks Messe Ost and Große Straße.

There are only a very limited number of disabled parking spaces at the venues, for which a parking permit must be obtained in advance from the Kirchentag.

#### Cardboard box seats (Papphocker)

One of the features of Kirchentag is the cardboard box seating used in the halls. These are collapsible for taking away afterwards and they can be bought at the end of Saturday night at many of the venues for a suggested donation of 1 euro. Please contact the management team (Objektleitung) at the venue if you want to buy one. If you want more, larger quantities can be bought by arrangement.

#### **Closing services**

The Nuremberg Kirchentag will have two Closing services.

In the main Market Square (Hauptmarkt): Closing service from **10.00 to 11.00**.

In the Corn Market (Kornmarkt): Closing service in simple German, with holy communion, from **10.00 to 11.30**.

As the capacity of both these locations is limited, the Hauptmarkt service will also be shown on a live relay at Jakobsplatz.

Further information about the arrangements, including provision of gluten-free communion bread, spaces for people with disabilities can be found on the website ► kirchentag.de/schlussgottesdienst, as can further details for English speakers. Information will also be available at the International Centre.

#### Accessibility

Both locations are accessible and there will be a space reserved for wheelchair users and seating for those with limited mobility, with provision of sign-language and an induction loop. Tickets for these areas must be reserved in advance. kirchentag.de/inklusion.

Arrival and departure: Because of the large numbers attending you are advised to allow plenty of time and arrive early for the service. A pre-programme will start at **09.00**. There is music afterwards for those who are able to stay for while.

#### Left Luggage and Lost Property

No luggage or rucksacks are allowed at the venues, but you can leave your bags at the left-luggage facility in Nelson-Mandela Square while you attend the Closing Service. Lost items can also be handed in at the Kirchentag lost property

#### **Digital Programme**

Access to digital events can be found at **kirchentag.de/digital**. This will have centralised live streaming of the Kirchentag from Thursday to Saturday, in particular the programme on the "hybrid stage". One of the Opening Services on Wednesday and one of the Closing Services on Sunday, including the pre-programme and the follow-up session, will be streamed. Many of the events that are shown, and which can be watched at home, will also have German sign language interpretation and subtitles.

In addition to this central streaming a selection of other events will be available on demand – partly pre-recorded, partly broadcast live. Access to these is via the Programme database at <a href="https://www.kirchentag.de/digitales-programm">kirchentag.de/digitales-programm</a>. Information about the start time, together with the videos, can be found in the details of those events in the app and on the website (in German). Some events will also be available to view after the Kirchentag in the media library (Mediathek).

It will also be possible to participate digitally in some live-streamed events if you have registered a free account at **My Kirchentag**. See headings *Public participation* and *My Kirchentag*.

#### **Donations and grants**

The Kirchentag is a charitable organisation, dependent on donations. The Kirchentag is open to all, regardless of religion and background. #### **Drinking water**

Tap water is the best source of refreshment and is also kind to both your purse and the environment. The Kirchentag provides free drinking water in many locations. Please bring your own water bottles (not glass) to fill up. In addition, the city of Nuremberg provides drinking fountains, maintained by N-Ergie Ltd. If you have a refillable water bottle with you, then you can also get free tap water in shops that display the "Refill" sign on the door.

#### **Emergency doctor (Ärztlicher Bereitschaftsdienst)**

There are first aid stations in many places (see heading *First Aid*). If it is not possible for you to get to one of these during opening hours you can try contacting the on-call medical service, tel 116 117, or find a doctor to see you without an appointment at one of the addresses below.

The on-call service is not to be confused with the emergency ambulance service which is available for life-threatening situations. In that case call the emergency service on 112.

### Environment

The Kirchentag is one of the most environmentally friendly mega-events of its kind and since 2007 has met the criteria for the European EMAS certificate. Please support us in minimising the negative impact of the Kirchentag on the environment, for example by using public transport, drinking tap water, carefully separating rubbish, walking or cycling to venues and using the organic food provided at the Kirchentag. See also the headings *Bicycle hire, Drinking water, Food and refreshments, Travel,* and *Waste*.

### e-ticket

For the first time at Kirchentag you can get your ticket in digital format. This can be activated through your personal account with *My Kirchentag* using the Kirchentag app. ► kirchentag.de/app. After installing the app, log into your *My Kirchentag* account. You can choose the menu structure in English.

You can also log into your account online at **kirchentag.de/en/my-kirchentag** and go to **My profile** (Mein Profil). There you will find a QR code. Scan this with the Kirchentag app and your account will then be saved on the app.

Go to the menu item **My ticket** where you will see a list of the tickets you have ordered, both e-tickets and any paper tickets you may have ordered. In order to be able to use an e-ticket you need to activate it on your smartphone. Each ticket can be activated/deactivated by swiping to the left. Activated tickets will be highlighted in blue.

For the ticket control operated by our stewards at the entrance to events, you will need to tap on the activated ticket to open the graphic display. For inspectors on public transport use the button *Travel pass* (Fahrausweis) to find your ÖPNV travel pass.

You can enter onto your smartphone not just your own e-ticket, but also all the tickets for your family and friends. The number on your activated ticket indicates the number of people for whom you have e-tickets on your device. By swiping in the bottom area of the display you can show several tickets in succession.

Please note that for security reasons it is not possible to download an e-ticket onto more than one device. If someone else has ordered an e-ticket for you, you need to get a ticket code from them, which you then enter on your own device, using the button *Add booking* (Buchung hinzufügen), in order to activate the e-ticket. If you have ordered tickets for several people then you need to give them the ticket code. You can find the code in the app under *My group* (meine Gruppe), from where you can send it to them directly by messenger-app or by email. A ticket code always consists of two letters and two numbers followed by a dash and a series of six numbers, for example U8H7–654321.

Please note: e-tickets can only be activated on a smartphone. It is not possible to print them out yourself.

#### **First Aid**

First Aid support at all the larger event venues is provided by the St John's Emergency Service (Johanniter-Unfallhilfe) in co-operation with the Bavarian Red Cross and other first aid agencies. In cases of life-threatening illness or injury call the ambulance service on telephone no 112.

### **First Aid stations**

During the opening events on Wednesday evening there will be plenty of First Aid Stations in the Nuremberg Old Town (Altstadt). The exact locations are marked with a first-aid symbol on the special leaflet for the Evening of Encounters (Abend der Begegnung) which will be handed out on the night.

From **Thursday** to **Saturday** there will also be First Aid stations in all the larger event venues. You will find these marked with the first-aid symbol on the city plan in the app, online and in print. On **Sunday** the First Aid stations will be at the main stages.

The Glass Restaurant offers an organic lunch menu that changes each day, prepared by trainees of the project "Ecological catering in large-scale kitchens". The ingredients are sourced from the local region and are fairly traded.

In the café area you will find organically-grown fair-trade tea and coffee specialities.

#### **International Centre**

The International Centre (IZ) is located in the central area of the Nuremberg Convention Centre (NCC Mitte) at the Nuremberg exhibition centre (Messe). It is just to the left of the main entrance. It provides services for participants from abroad and their hosts. The IZ team is available to offer help, in a variety of languages, with any questions or problems concerning the Kirchentag, the programme or accommodation. In addition there are volunteer language stewards who will go with you to events where no interpretation is offered. They do not give a full translation, but will give you an outline of what is being said. There is a café offering the opportunity for a short break and meeting up with other international participants and members of the International Committee.

#### **Mobile telephone**

Please put your mobile phone on silent mode during all events. Charging facilities for mobiles can be found at various places in the main event areas. Please bring your own charger with you.

At the Nuremberg exhibition centre (Messe) there is a particular location in the meeting place (Begegnungsort) in Hall 8. In the midst of all the hustle and bustle of the Messe, this hall offers a space for recharging your batteries – your own, by sitting back and relaxing, as well as recharging your phone, and just taking time out for a while.

#### **My Kirchentag**

The most convenient way to use the app and the website for the programme is with a **My Kirchentag** account. Just register your personal account details for free at • kirchentag.de/login. You will find a link to the **My Kirchentag** page on the English language pages of the website, where you can register in English. Once you have logged into your account, you can download the app onto your phone. If you go to **my profile** you can scan the QR code using the app and that will link the app to your account. If you have opted for a digital ticket for the Kirchentag, you will find it in the app at My Kirchentag under My ticket. You need to activate the e-ticket on the device you will be using at the Kirchentag. Only then is it validated.

Once you have activated your ticket, and if it includes free travel on the public transport system, then you can also display the travel pass in the app. That way you have both your Kirchentag ticket and your travel pass on your smartphone all the time. See heading *e-ticket*.

If you have booked accommodation through the Kirchentag, you can find the address under *My accommodation* and will be able to find your way there either on foot or by public transport.

The function *My programme* allows you to put together a personal Kirchentag programme. You can mark individual events in advance by using the asterisk at the top right of the online programme entry. If there is WiFi access where you are, the programme data will be updated so that you have the latest information.

#### Pastoral care and counselling

In the centre for psychological counselling and pastoral care (Psychologische Beratung und Seelsorge) you will find professional counsellors from the Church Counselling Service. They offer an opportunity to talk to specialists about stressful personal situations, difficult circumstances and current crises. Whilst there is no guarantee that you will find someone available who speaks English, you can make enquiries if you are in need of help. Or you can ask at the International Centre for help in finding someone to talk to. See heading *International Centre*.

#### **Public participation**

The Kirchentag thrives on the participation of visitors. Along with the usual options of contributing by submitting written comments or questions or by speaking at the floor microphones in the halls, there is now for the first time the possibility of participating digitally in some of the events via the app or online. If a particular event offers this option, you will find the link embedded at the bottom of the event details on the app or on the web. This function enables you to participate either on site or from elsewhere, for example at home via the live stream. There are two possibilities available - depending on the event concerned - firstly to submit questions or comments which you want discussed by the platform speakers, which will be collected and sorted by topic before being put forward by the spokespersons for the audience. This is done anonymously, although you may add your name if you wish. The second option is if the event wishes to test public opinion with a survey or vote (Umfrage und Abstimmung). In that case you will find at the bottom of the event details a field with this caption. At the start of the voting a three-digit code will be given and when you enter this into the box it will open a window with the question to be voted on. For both of these options you need to have a My Kirchentag account and to have logged into the app or the website before the event.

#### Safeguarding

The Kirchentag has developed a safeguarding policy, aimed at the prevention of sexualised discrimination and abuse. This sets out guidance on appropriate behaviour. In principle, any complaints which are regarded as abuse by the person affected, will be followed up. If the Kirchentag hears of a suspected case, an enquiry process will immediately be put in place. The policy sets out the relevant procedures and possible sanctions.

At the Kirchentag everyone should

- be treated fairly. No one has the right to threaten or intimidate, by the way they act, look at or speak to someone, show or take pictures. No one should be blackmailed, marginalised, abused or hit;
- decide for themselves when, where and by whom they are photographed or filmed;

- decide for themselves how close they want to get to someone else and when, how and where. No-one should be touched, massaged, stroked or kissed against their will, or be compelled to do this with someone else;
- have the right to say "NO" and to resist someone who hurts their feelings or those
  of others. "NO" means "no", whether expressed in words, looks or body language;
- not participate if something makes you anxious, or you find something disgusting or you feel uncomfortable with it;
- seek support from other people. If anyone feels uncomfortable or things are going badly for them, it is important to seek help.

### Scarf

In keeping with tradition, the Kirchentag scarf serves as a distinctive feature of the collective identity of those attending the 38th Kirchentag in Nuremberg 2023. The blue scarf is made of 100% organic cotton from certified organic producers and manufactured in Turkey. It is printed with the slogan "now is the time". You can get the scarf at numerous places at the event sites and in the shops for a recommended donation of 5 euro. See heading *Kirchentag Shop*.

### Security

The security of all participants is paramount for the Kirchentag. You can play your own part in achieving this goal:

- Bring a water bottle (not glass) and drink plenty of liquid through the day.
- Stay in the shade and use a sunhat.
- Protect your valuables from pickpockets.
- Don't take large items of luggage into the venues.
- Always stay alert and pay attention to other participants.
- Follow the instructions of security staff and stewards.
- Please understand if inconvenience and delay arise because of security precautions and stay calm in threatening situations.

In case of emergency ring 112 (fire / ambulance) or 110 (police), or look for a First Aid Station.

The Kirchentag works together with the security and regulatory authorities in putting in place a comprehensive security plan. This is constantly updated in accordance with the latest security situation.

### Service points (Servicepunkte) and Tickets

There are 3 tickets available: 5-days, single day and 16.00 tickets (valid after 4pm). These allow entry to all Kirchentag events for the respective period and include a travel pass for public transport in the local VGN network. Please note that there is no guarantee of entry to a particular event as this depends on the availability of places at the venue.

Tickets can be bought online, on the app, at ticket agencies, or during the Kirchentag from the Service Points.

The Service Points are the places to get information about the programme, changes to the programme and transport. You can also buy tickets and obtain a proof of attendance if needed. There is also a Kirchentag shop at two of the Service Points.

#### Sexual violence

Sexual discrimination and violence is always a misuse of power structures and trust. Such a large event as the Kirchentag inevitably involves interpersonal encounters and so we have developed a protocol of protection and care. The basis of this is that it is up to individuals to set their boundaries and what behaviour oversteps those boundaries. It is essential to have respect for one another and our boundaries (feelings, proximity and distance). Any action that is unacceptable to the other person and makes them feel uncomfortable means that a line has been crossed. Sexual harassment or undesired sexual approaches constitute sexual violence. This includes for example sexualised comments or actions that are demeaning or shaming, unwanted physical proximity or the exercise of power - particularly with regard to children and young people. We all bear responsibility to keep our eyes and ears open to ensure a Kirchentag free of violence.

In threatening situations or in cases of actual violence, please contact the police on 110. There is also counselling and pastoral care available for those affected. See heading *Pastoral care and counselling*.

If no counsellors are available to offer help in English, then ask for help at the International Centre.

#### Simple German (Leichte Sprache)

Simple German is a simplified form of everyday speech. Many people can understand simple German more easily, for example people with learning difficulties. Also people whose first language is not German. There are Bible texts on the internet in simple German:

There is worship in simple German, the opening service on Wednesday at Kornmarkt, and the closing service on Sunday at Kornmarkt. There are tips on the website in simple German 
kirchentag.de/leichte-sprache. Also in the Kirchentag app.

#### Smoking ban

Smoking is not allowed in any of the venues where events are taking place. The no-smoking rule also applies to communal accommodation in schools. This ban also includes e-cigarettes.

#### **Social Media**

You can use various social media networks to find interviews, look behind the scenes, and get impressions of events you couldn't attend yourself, as well as information and comment. The Kirchentag has its own pages on ► Instagram, ► Facebook, ► Twitter and ► Mastodon. Use the hashtags #Kirchentag and #jetztIstDieZeit.

Note: Although these are all in German, you still might be interested to visit them and view the pictures and comments. And they will certainly welcome any comments made in English, as a reminder of the international presence at the Kirchentag! See heading *Website*.

#### Songbook (Liederheft)

The material for the songbook was produced by a group of 30 writers and musicians in a special workshop to write new songs based on the theme and Bible texts for the Nuremberg Kirchentag. A committee of volunteers then went through the results and selected 34 of the songs for the songbook *Singen ist Jetzt*. (Now is the time for singing). Participants get a free copy of the song book (see below) and it can be bought from the bookshop for 4 euro.

### Travel

The Kirchentag is an environmentally friendly event. We therefore ask our participants to choose an eco-friendly means of travel. You can also offset the  $CO_2$  emissions from your journey to and from the Kirchentag by making a donation to the climate collection on our website at the time you register your booking  $\blacktriangleright$  klima-kollekte.de. We recommend travel by train if possible and on the German Railways website  $\blacktriangleright$  www.bahn.com/en you will find information in English about rail services. You can also book digital tickets there. Please note that because of construction work on the railways at the time of the Kirchentag, there may be a bus replacement service on some routes. You should also note that at Nuremberg railway station the only lifts are situated at the West Tunnel.

Your Kirchentag ticket is valid for travel on public transport within the VGN network area. Please avoid travelling by car as the traffic can be very congested in the city. All the event locations and the accommodation provided by the Kirchentag is easily reached by public transport, on foot or by bicycle.

#### Waste disposal (Abfall or Müll)

Please do not drop rubbish or litter on the streets or open spaces. Avoid disposable packaging and only take brochures and leaflets that you are really interested in. Please support us by using the separate collection bins for paper, recyclable items (Wertstoff), and non-recyclable (Restabfall or Restmüll).

Note: the distribution of leaflets and advertising material unrelated to the Kirchentag is not allowed at any of the event locations.

#### Website

#### Webcodes

In order to facilitate the transition from printed programme to digital programme, you will find webcodes in the programme, which you can enter into the programme search field on the app or on the web. Both individual events and other events, such as those in a particular format or series, will be enabled via their own webcode. All the webcodes are a combination of two letters and two digits and will be distinguished from the surrounding text by a different colour and typeface: XY99.

#### WiFi (WLAN)

In parts of inner-city Nuremberg, on public transport including bus and tram stops, at the Nuremberg Messe and at some other selected event venues, there is free WiFi (WLAN) available from different internet service providers. There is no single WiFi service covering the whole area for Kirchentag visitors.

#### Workshop house

The Lutheran University of Applied Sciences in Nuremberg has been turned into a centre for workshops on the various topics of the Kirchentag. In order to ensure an orderly access to the workshops, tickets will be handed out at the main entrance from 60 minutes before the particular workshop is due to begin.

If all the places for a workshop have been taken, then why not try the one next door! Note: These are likely to be all in German, but if a topic interests you, why not book a language steward at the International Centre to go with you?
